This weekend our Year 4 students receive their First Eucharist. Aside from being one of the seven Sacraments it is truly a momentous event in the life of a young Catholic. The Eucharist is central to the celebration of the Mass and the Mass is itself the central act of worship in the Catholic Church. By extension, this then makes the celebration of a child's First Eucharist absolutely central in the life of a Catholic school. Congratulations to all our students, and to the other Whyalla students who join us during this special weekend.

Parent Help

We assist parents and families in a range of ways at Samaritan. One of the more obvious ways has been through financial assistance but we also provide advice and direction in a range of social and emotional areas for parents/caregivers to assist in raising their children. One area that may arise is if and when your child may be bullied at school. There are strategies for parents to look at when this may happen and there are also tips around what not to do or say when your child is telling you they are bullied. In brief, some of the things we highly recommend NOT to do are: immediately assume it is bullying (not every time your child has an issue with another child it is bullying), not tell us, tell everyone else about it on social media or tell other parents who the alleged 'bully' is. Sadly whilst some parents may feel all that helps, all it does is make things worse both for your child and potentially for yourselves later.

A Change of Seasons

We have entered the season of winter and there are signs all around that the days are getting shorter and colder. Wood smoke fills the air in the evenings and we are greeted with fog filled skies in the morning. Some families are making soups and favourite scarves and jackets are making an appearance. Winter is upon us and we give thanks for this season and all the good things that it brings.

The Church has entered a new season also and there are signs around that herald this new stage in the liturgical calendar. We have finished Easter (which lasts for 50 days) and begun this new period of Ordinary Time with the celebration of Pentecost. Pentecost, as you may remember, is the time when the Holy Spirit descends upon the disciples and Mary, who are then given the strength and encouragement to go out into the world to take the Good News to all.

Green is the colour that adorns our prayer tables, the church altars and Priests vestments. Green is the colour chosen to signify life and the events of the everyday that help us create strong families and communities. With the help of the Holy Spirit, disciples of Jesus live by example and work to bring peace and love into the world.

Today, it is we who are called to take the Good News to the world and with the help of the same Holy Spirit that descended on the first disciples, we are also given strength and encouragement to live our lives in a way that honours God and brings peace and healing to others.

Sporting Achievements

Dance

Samaritan College is very proud to have a student who has made the state team for the Australian Calisthenics Federation National Competitions to be held in Sydney later this year. Abby Goodwin has been competing in competitive calisthenics since she was eleven years old and this is the first time that she has been selected to represent South Australia. Calisthenics is a team-based competitive performing art that takes in elements of rhythmic gymnastics and ballet.

Originally Abby trained in Whyalla, but recently has had to undertake her training in Adelaide as there wasn't enough girls for a team in her age group. Travelling every weekend to Adelaide has paid off with her gaining a place on the State team in the Open age group. Abby is very conscientious with her studies and balances school and dance commitments by making use of the college library most afternoons.

We wish Abby all the best at the Nationals.

Cycling

The Cycling SA State Road Championships were held over the June long weekend. We were very fortunate to have Daniel Siwek competing in the under 19 age group over a race distance of 100km and taking just over 3 hours. The results show that this was a tightly contested battle with nothing really separating the top 4 places. A rush of blood saw Daniel leave the peloton with about 1km left in the race. He lead the final stages up to the last 20m when three others caught him and just beat him over the line.

Next year Daniel will be competing in the U23 age group and will need to race 150km. Whilst he hasn't nominated for the Nationals, and while doubtful about nominating next year, it is something he is considering. Placing in the Nationals could gain him a spot on a team in the Tour Down Under.

Afternoon Pickup

Parents would know very well that there are no designated drop-off and pick-up zones around the secondary campus. That is, council hasn't allocated an area that has restricted parking. As such many students are parking in places that are closest to the college gates. Whilst most of these vehicles leave at the end of the day; some, particularly Year 12s might be making use of

the library for study purposes. So their vehicles might not be leaving when you are coming to collect your children.

As a courtesy to all we ask that parents do not rush our young drivers, enabling them the time to organise themselves and leave when they are ready.

Use of Mobile Phones

A reminder that children shouldn't be contacting parents directly during the school day. The college has a number of qualified senior first aid officers who can deal with the usual issues that children face. It is recommended that children who are feeling unwell present to the office, have a general assessment with one of the trained senior first aid staff who will contact parents if necessary.

Homework

Recently we have been asked about our homework policy. Students are encouraged to undertake homework each evening after school. In some instances this would be continuing on with assignment work, however, there are times when few assignments are being done. At these times students should be reviewing the work covered during the day and consolidating their understanding.

Whilst some will think that re-reading what was done during the day is sufficient there is countless evidence to suggest that this doesn't assist in developing the deeper understanding required to be successful. In English if students are asked to re-read sections of the novel, they should be making notes after each chapter that outline how characters are developing.

In the areas of Mathematics and Science students should be engaging with questions to strengthen their understanding of the material.

Please encourage your child to undertake the minimum amount of homework each evening as outlined in our homework policy, on the website.
